TO: Resident/Business Owners on Broadway between Main Street and Osborne Street

RE: Downtown Pavement Renewals Project – 2024 Construction

Traffic implications: Long-term Lane closures on Westbound Broadway

Dear Downtown Stakeholder,

As planned, the fifth and final phase of the Downtown Pavement Renewals Project is scheduled to begin April 29, 2024.

This year work will take place on westbound Broadway and will be broken into two segments:

- Westbound Broadway between Osborne Street and Carlton Street: April 29, 2024 to July 2024
- Westbound Broadway between Carlton Street and Main Street: July 2024 to October 2024

## Work includes:

- Traffic signals installations
- Sewer-related underground work
- Pavement rehabilitation
- Curb replacement
- New sidewalk construction
- Tree work

## Traffic impacts during construction:

- One lane of traffic will be maintained throughout
  - Other lanes will be removed at various times.
- Construction will be completed half of the road at a time
- All parking and loading zones on Westbound Broadway will be removed during construciton
- Pedestrian access and Transit service will be maintained
  - Temporary bus stop relocations or closures may be required at various times
- Pedestrian and vehicle access to businesses and parking lots will be maintained as much as possible with short-term, temporary closures as required
  - All disruptions to access will be minimized and discussed with the affected businesses and/or residents in advance
