

### Background


The Bridgwater neighbourhood developer has requested that a requirement for pedestrian lighting along some of the visitable pathways be removed from the development agreement. Visitable pathways are the public pathways located in the drainage area behind accessible homes with no-step entries (called "visitable homes"). The City of Winnipeg gathered feedback from residents on support and opposition for the installation of lighting along several visitable pathways in the Bridgwater neighbourhood.

### Engagement & Promotion

Postcards were mailed to 4,079 houses, condominiums and apartment units in the Bridgwater neighbourhood, inviting residents to provide input through an online survey. The postcard also provided a link to a webpage with additional information.

Participant addresses were collected to determine which survey respondents directly backed onto the visitable pathways.


A total of 204 survey responses were received from October 29 to November 15, 2018. Two responses were from outside Bridgwater, as one of the Canada Post mail routes overlapped with an adjacent neighbourhood.



Of those who participated in the survey, 48 were from those who back directly onto the visitable pathways. In total, 276 homes in the area back onto the visitable pathways where the requirement for lighting will be decided.

#### Support for lighting:





### What We Heard

Responses were separated to determine support or opposition for lighting by those who back onto the pathways and those who use the pathways.

The final survey question asked if the participant had anything they would like to add. These responses were categorized into themes to provide further reasons for support or opposition for pathway lighting.

Increased security (30), ease of pathway use (12), and improved neighbourhood aesthetics (3) were the top reasons for supporting pathway lighting. One respondent indicated that lighting is *“a very important element to the appeal, safety and accessibility of the Bridgwater neighborhoods and pathways.”*

Light pollution (14), decreased security (5), and impacts to nature (2) were the top reasons for opposing pathway lighting. Those who back onto the visitable pathways noted their concerns about light disturbance in their home (9), for example: *“I am concerned that the light will enter the bedrooms at the rear of my home.”*

Respondents (18) also advocated for improved pathway maintenance, including snow clearing, grass cutting, and drainage.

### Limitations

Due to a Canada Post strike, postcards may have been delayed in arriving to residents. The strike was rotating so residents may have received postcards with other delayed mail. The survey period was long enough to allow for delays in postcard delivery.

Expressing the impacts of lighting is difficult with photos and text. Those with properties that back on to the visitable pathways may not fully understand how the lighting will impact them despite the images and explanation of potential for light spillage. In addition, the number of lights and the exact location of lighting were not provided as the design for the pathway lighting is not available.



### Next Steps

Key findings and survey results will be shared with the Standing Policy Committee on Property and Development, Heritage and Downtown Development for consideration on the January 7, 2019. City Council is expected to make a final decision on amending the development agreement at the January 31, 2019 Council meeting.





## Q2 Do you use the public pathways called 'visitable pathways' in the Bridgwater neighbourhood (shown in red on the map above and in the photo)?


